Almost 50% of the recipients were MANS member schools, receiving a combined \$522,915.00, 27% of the total grant. The money will be used to improve school safety. Congratulations to this year's Michigan State Police Competitive School Safety Grant Awardees. MANS will advocate for another round of school safety grants in this year's budget cycle. Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Open For Comment

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) has drafted the Consolidated State Plan for the ESSA and is asking for comments. The draft plan can be found by clicking <u>here</u>.

Comments can be submitted until March 16, 2017 by <u>emailing</u> MDE or by mail to ESSA State Plan Comments, Michigan Department of Education, State Superintendent Office, P.O. Box 30008, Lansing, MI 48909. The MDE plans on submitting a final draft on April 3, 2017.

CPR and AED Training in Schools

On December 28, 2016 the Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) Training in Schools Act (PA 388)

went into effect. Under this new law, schools are to provide CPR and AED training to students in grade 7th through 12th beginning in the 2017-18 school year. While this new law is not required of non-public schools, it is highly recommended. To read more about Public Act 388, click <u>here</u>.
