MANS recently signed on to a national coalition advocating for a national tax credit to expand education scholarships for low and middle income families. My Kid's Future is a national, non-partisan grassroots group of parents and advocates for children working together to encourage Congress and the President to pass a tax credit for Americans contributing to scholarship granting organizations.

EdTaxCredit50 - My Kid's Future



The My Kid's Future project is an effort to enact a national education scholarship tax credit. This project is critical to demonstrating to the President and Congress that the tax credit has broad-based support. Each of your schools can play an important role in helping to build this grassroots movement. Below are a few ways your school community can become involved in this movement:

- 1. Tell your parents and teachers about My Kid's Future.
- 2. Share your content with My Kid's Future for posting on their website or Facebook.
- 3. Identify parents and other supporters in your area that My Kid's Future can train to serve as contacts for the press in their area. My Kid's Future will provide all resources to train and book these parents on local radio and television to discuss the tax credit. 
