The 2018-2019 Michigan Teacher of the Year

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is asking educators, administrators, students, and parents to help it find the next <u>Michigan</u> <u>Teacher of the Year</u> (MTOY). The Michigan Teacher of the Year program, sponsored by the Meemic Foundation, recognizes outstanding educational leaders across Michigan for their work to elevate the teaching profession.

MDE's <u>online nomination form</u> is open until Friday, October 20 at 11:59 p.m., for people to nominate a teacher or teachers whom they feel are exceptional educators and have made substantial contributions to their profession.

FIRST Robotics Grant

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) announces the 2017-2018 FIRST Robotics Grant to improve mathematics, science, and technology skills. This year's grant has been expanded to include an additional **\$300,000 for FIRST Robotics or Science Olympiad programming for nonpublic schools.** Nonpublic schools must be registered with MDE in order to be eligible to apply.

The grant application will be available through the Michigan Electronic Grants System Plus (MEGS+) on September 26, 2017.


