# Council for American Private Education (CAPE) Action Alert for Title IIA Funding

Congress is getting closer to approving a budget for FY 2018. The House and Senate bills differ on funding for Title IIA. The House wants to eliminate funding for Title IIA while the Senate has approved, at the committee level, funding the program at \$2 billion.

#### **Recertification Reminder**

Michigan Administrative Rule <u>R390.1121</u> indicates that educator certificates expire on June 30 of the expiration year. Educators can begin applying for renewal on January 1 of the expiration year and should begin preparing application materials now. Educators do not lose time on a certificate by applying before it expires.

Educators needing to progress from provisional to professional are encouraged to apply well before the June 30 deadline. Applying after June 1 will require effectiveness ratings in the MDE personnel report.

#### 2018 Governor's Student Design Contest

Michigan high school, junior high, and elementary school students are encouraged to submit designs for the cover of the 2018 Michigan State of the State program contest, Gov. Rick Snyder announced. Gov. Snyder will deliver his eighth and final State of the State address to a joint session of the Michigan Legislature in the State House Chambers on Tuesday, January 23, 2018, at 7 p.m. The winner of the student design contest will have the opportunity to meet Gov. Snyder and attend the address with one guest.

Students can submit their designs through Friday, January 5. The winning design will be announced Friday, January 12, 2018. Contest entries should be sized to fit on a 5.5 inch x 8.5 inch cover. On a separate page, students should include with their submission their name, phone number, address, and email address, as well as their parent or guardian's name, phone number, address, and email address.
