2015 Ivan E. Zylstra Award

Ivan E. Zylstra Award History

The Ivan E. Zylstra award recognizes an individual who is committed to Non-public education and has contributed significantly to the work of MANS. The honoree has demonstrated a loyalty to non-public schools and a willingness to promote the rights of Non-public school students. He or she has been involved in school and community programs.

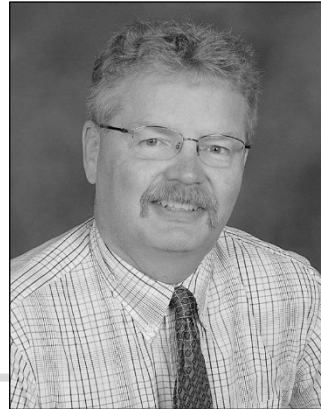
This award, given by the Michigan Association of Non-public Schools, is named in honor of Ivan E. Zylstra, former President Emeritus of the MANS Board of Trustees. Mr. Zylstra was involved with MANS at its inception and served as its first president. He held the position of Director of Government Relations for Christian Schools International, and served as a member of the President's Panel on non-public Education (1970-1972) that studied the place and contributions of Non-public schools in the United States. Mr. Zylstra entered eternity in 1990.

Symbolism

The symbol of the water vessel was chosen to represent the Ivan E. Zylstra award. The sailboat, a vessel common to the waters surrounding Michigan's peninsulas, exemplifies freedom, search and destination with a forward movement that is steeped in tradition. Powered by the wind of God that drives it ever onward, the vessel of education sails upon the vast sea of knowledge.

2018 Ivan E. Zylstra Award Winner **Dr. Bruce Braun**

In 1977, Dr. Bruce Braun had two teaching positions that would forever impact his view on education. In April, Bruce was hired to finish out the year at Holy Name Catholic School in Birmingham. He was the P.E. teacher for three months and felt blessed to teach in his college major. In July of 1977, Bruce received a Call to teach Religion at Lutheran North High School in Macomb. In addition to teaching six classes, he supervised a study hall, drove a morning bus route, coached three seasons and lived 45 minutes away in Royal Oak where his wife was also a first year teacher. It was crazy, but they were in love with each other (and still are) and both fell in love with teaching at Lutheran Schools and being Christ followers in southeast Michigan.

In July of 2017, Bruce retired as the Superintendent of Schools for the Michigan District, Lutheran Church Missouri Synod after forty years of being a passionate advocate for Faith-based Education. Bruce's career course included teaching and counseling but quickly evolved into Director of Guidance, Assistant Principal, Principal, Assistant Superintendent and for twelve years as Superintendent of Lutheran Schools. He has been involved with MANS as a member of the Board of Directors, co-chair of the MANS Education Conference and Expo in Detroit, a member of the Executive Board serving as Treasurer and on the Finance Committee, as well as planning for the Administrators' Conference. Bruce feels he has been uniquely blessed to work with his Catholic and Christian school counterparts who encourage him to boldly share Christ through faith based education. He says, "I have treasured listening and learning from others who approach the world in a slightly different way but have a biblical worldview shaping their perspective. I greatly appreciate the opportunity MANS has afforded me to help share Christ through an organization that brings together three unique faith backgrounds and encourages us to make sure heaven is full and hell empty come judgement day." Bruce is currently serving as interim principal at St. Michael Lutheran School in Wayne, Michigan.

He and his wife of forty years, Jayne, are blessed with three adult children and three grandchildren.

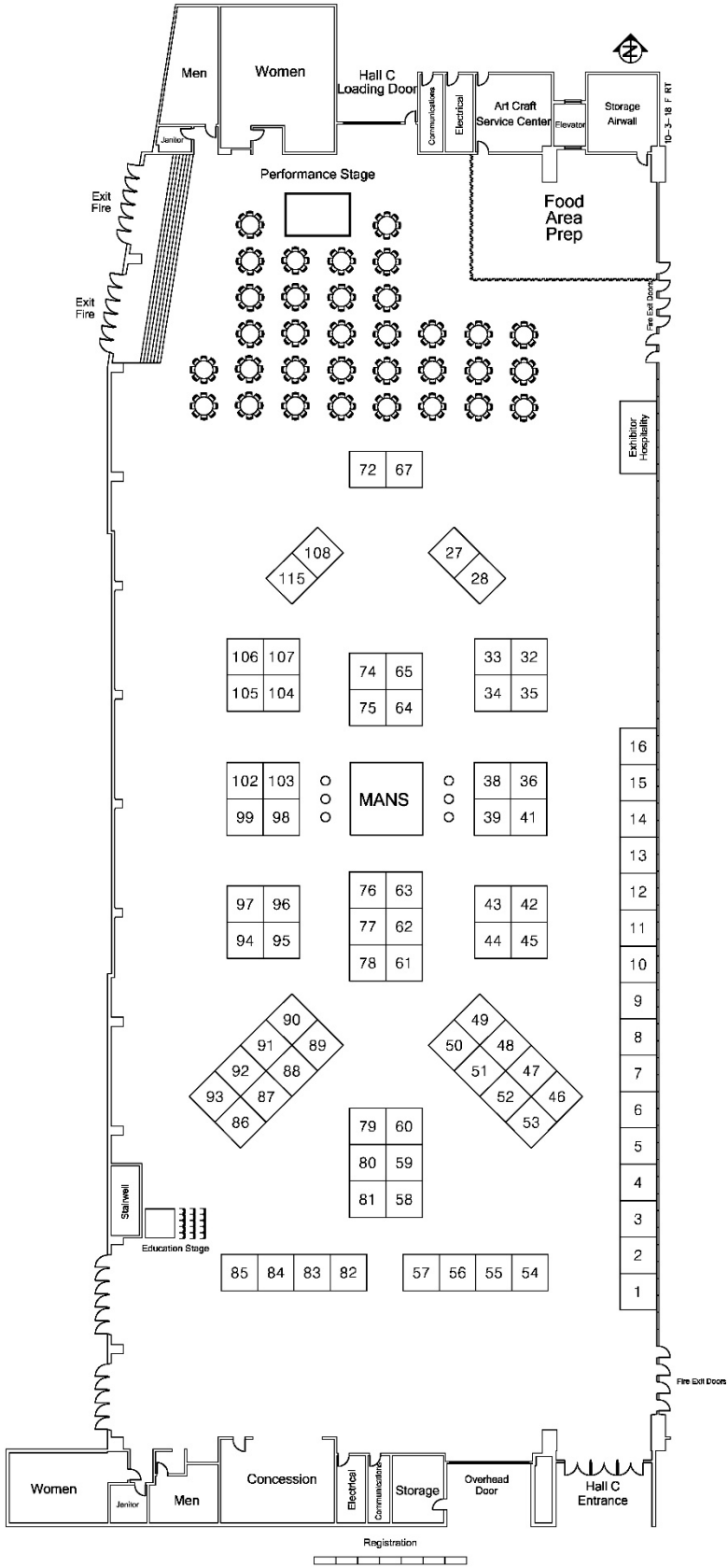
